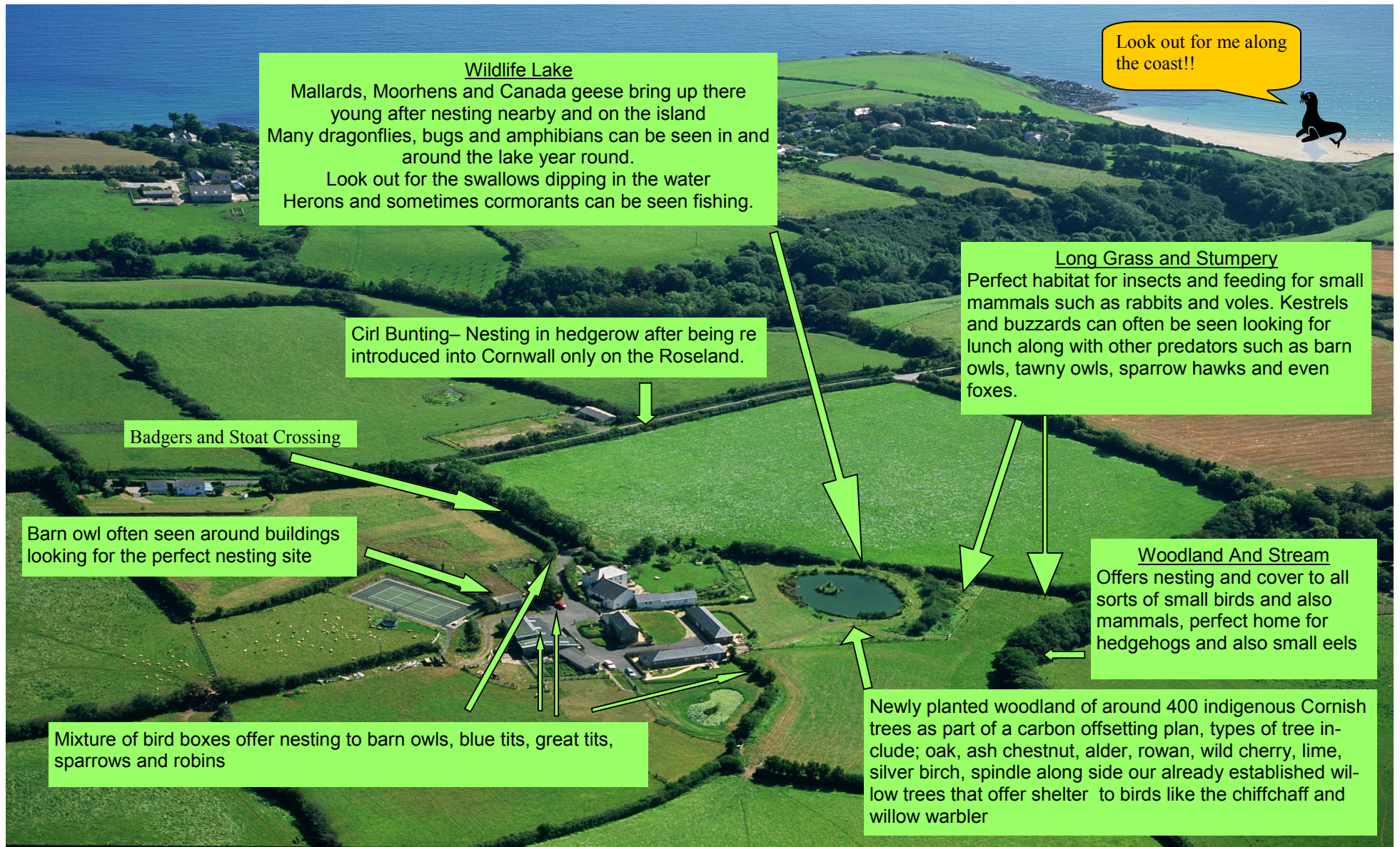


Pollaughan Farm - What can you see?



Wildlife Lake
Mallards, Moorhens and Canada geese bring up there young after nesting nearby and on the island
Many dragonflies, bugs and amphibians can be seen in and around the lake year round.
Look out for the swallows dipping in the water
Hérons and sometimes cormorants can be seen fishing.

Look out for me along the coast!!

Long Grass and Stumpery
Perfect habitat for insects and feeding for small mammals such as rabbits and voles. Kestrels and buzzards can often be seen looking for lunch along with other predators such as barn owls, tawny owls, sparrow hawks and even foxes.

Badgers and Stoat Crossing

Barn owl often seen around buildings looking for the perfect nesting site

Woodland And Stream
Offers nesting and cover to all sorts of small birds and also mammals, perfect home for hedgehogs and also small eels

Mixture of bird boxes offer nesting to barn owls, blue tits, great tits, sparrows and robins

Newly planted woodland of around 400 indigenous Cornish trees as part of a carbon offsetting plan, types of tree include; oak, ash chestnut, alder, rowan, wild cherry, lime, silver birch, spindle along side our already established willow trees that offer shelter to birds like the chiffchaff and willow warbler
